

Dear brethren,

The Fifth Commandment is: You shall not murder.

The first three Commandments, in Lutheran tradition often referred to as the First Table of the Law, has taught us to live with God in faith and worship, looking to Him as Saviour and Giver of all things good, calling upon His name in prayer and praise, and receiving salvation from Him with His Word of salvation and with the Sacrament.

That which we often refer to as the Second Table of the Law teaches us how we owe it to God to live and deal with other people. And the first Commandment on the Second Table is the Fourth Commandment, which teaches us to obey the authorities and laws of society. It mentions specifically the most basic unit of society: Honour your father and your mother! And it teaches us that the obedience we owe to God is real obedience, shown in our real life to real people, because of their position, in which God has placed them, rather than of our choice and desire. In this, we honour and obey God, for there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been set in place by God.

Romans 13:1

So in our life with other people we are to show our obedience to God first by not being criminals and bad people. We are to obey the laws and authorities of the community in which we live - except when they directly demand that we act against the Word will of God. First and foremost this would be when they demand that we set His Commandments regarding faith and worship aside.

But the Law of God forbids us to go against His Word and will also in our lives with other people, and also when the laws and authorities of society, which we would otherwise be faithbound to obey, demand that we do.

Having learnt, then, that we owe it to God to obey Him in what we actually do, and obey His commands as the laws of society teaches us to obey, His Law begins to teach us more specifically what it is His will that we always do and never do in our dealings with other people, even if ungodly orders of society would demand otherwise.

And the first thing we learn that we should never do is this: You shall not murder.

God is Lord of Life. Not only is He the Giver of life, He is Himself the fullness of life. And His will for all human beings is for us to have life and have it in its fullness; it is for this purpose that He made us to begin with, in order for us to live with Him and share with Him that fullness of life which is His, and have all things good given to us out of His goodness.

This is His will for us, and for all people made in His image. And we should no get in the way of His will, neither for ourselves, nor for other people. Therefore we should not kill people, nor ruin their lives. First, do no harm!, as physicians are taught. in accordance with natural law. Instead, we should do good. Or as our Catechism says it: We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbour in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.


