Notes for the Sunday

Palm Sunday commemorates our Lord Jesus arriving in Jerusalem to suffer and die, when the crowds celebrated Him, and many cut off branches from the palms and waved them in triumph.

This Sunday falls in **Passiontide**, and stands in the shadow of the sufferings and death of Christ. As such, not only are the *Great Gloria* and the *Alleluia* omitted, but also the *Glorias* after the introit and the *Nunc Dimitis*; furthermore, the **liturgy is spoken** rather than sung.

About Holy Communion
